



POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS

Side effects are typically those associated with the injecting process

1. Damage to blood vessels, hematoma, infection and/or irritation.
2. Temporary or permanent nerve damage that may result in pain or numbness.
3. As with any injection-based treatment, infection is a slight possibility.

It is important that injecting clinicians are trained in PRP therapy and have trained knowledge in facial anatomy.

Despite PRP being an autologous treatment, two serious complications that have been reported were most likely due to injecting concentrated PRP inadvertently into an artery. The clinicians were not using Cellenis PRP and there is no direct evidence that this was indeed the cause of the complication.
